



About Oregon Agriculture in the Classroom

Oregon Agriculture in the Classroom Foundation provides free curriculum, resources, and training to all K-12 Oregon teachers. We promote using agriculture to teach science, math, social sciences, English language arts, art and nutrition across existing curriculum.



OUR IMPACT

Over 300,000 Oregon students benefited from Oregon AITC lessons, materials and events last school year. Last year, 860 volunteers presented our lesson and Agricultural Literacy Project book in 912 classrooms across Oregon, reaching 19,495 students!

Lesson Plans

Oregon Agriculture in the Classroom offers over 400 searchable, standards-based lesson plans for K-12 teachers. Lesson plans can be accessed directly from our website and are aligned with Common Core State Standards, Next Generation Science Standards and Oregon Social Sciences Standards.



Project Kits & Lending Library

A variety of educational materials including project kits with all essential materials, books and other resources are available through our lending library. Many of these teaching materials are Oregon-based and focus on topics related to agriculture, natural resources and the environment. Literacy Project

The annual Oregon Agriculture in the Classroom Agricultural Literacy Project improves both the literacy of Oregon's young readers and their knowledge of agriculture.

How it Works

Trained volunteers are paired with Oregon schools and read the Agricultural Literacy Project's featured book to students in grades K-4. Volunteers then lead a fun, hands-on lesson with students to reinforce the book's message and share their personal connection to agriculture. Start to finish, it takes about 45 minutes of class time.







Educator Workshops

Oregon Agriculture in the Classroom offers FREE topic-specific educator workshops. Educators will be introduced to AITC's cross-curricular activities, lessons and resources that use agricultural themes to teach reading, science, math and several other core subjects.


